Testing

The Upper Cumberland health departments are continuing to offer free COVID testing. Health department testing will be conducted on Tuesdays and Thursdays of each week. Self-testing will be available at the health departments Monday, Wednesday and Fridays of each week. Vaccine has arrived in Tennessee. Vaccine supply is limited and therefore it is being prioritized by phases. MRC Volunteer Identification Card

It is time once again for volunteers to receive their MRC Volunteer Identification Card with the expiration date of 2022. If you are receiving this newsletter through the mail your card is enclosed. All volunteers that receive the newsletter via email will receive your card through the mail during the month of January. This identification card allows volunteers through security during a public health event where the MRC has been deployed. It is important for volunteers to not self-deploy during an event. Volunteers will be notified by the Tennessee Volunteer Mobilizer Alerting System of any request for assistance from the MRC unit. Only pre-identified, documented volunteers with a current MRC Volunteer Identification who have been asked to report for duty by the MRC Coordinator will be allowed through security. This identification is only to be used to gain entrance to the work site. Once a volunteer has been deployed and reported to the requested work site, each volunteer will receive an official MRC Identification Badge to be used throughout their deployment.
