### **COVID-19 Update**

As of January 17, 2022, 1,320,705 Tennesseans have been fully vaccinated that's 51.8% and 58.6% have received one dose. Vaccines are still available, to find a location near you visit vaccines.gov.

Since March 2020, the Upper Cumberland Region's health departments have conducted 175,657 COVID tests. Since December 2020, the health departments have given out 17,812 take home tests. Free COVID testing is still available at all health departments. ### MRC Volunteer Identification Card

It is time once again for volunteers to receive their MRC Volunteer Identification Card with the expiration date of 2023. All volunteers will receive their card through the mail during the month of January. This identification card allows volunteers through security during a public health event where the MRC has been deployed. It is important for volunteers to not self-deploy during an event. Volunteers will be notified by the Tennessee Volunteer Mobilizer Alerting System of any request for assistance from the MRC unit. Only pre-identified, documented volunteers with a current MRC Volunteer Identification who have been asked to report for duty by the MRC Coordinator will be allowed through security. This identification is only to be used to gain entrance to the work site. Once a volunteer has been deployed and reported to the requested work site, each volunteer will receive a MRC Identification Badge to be used throughout their deployment.
